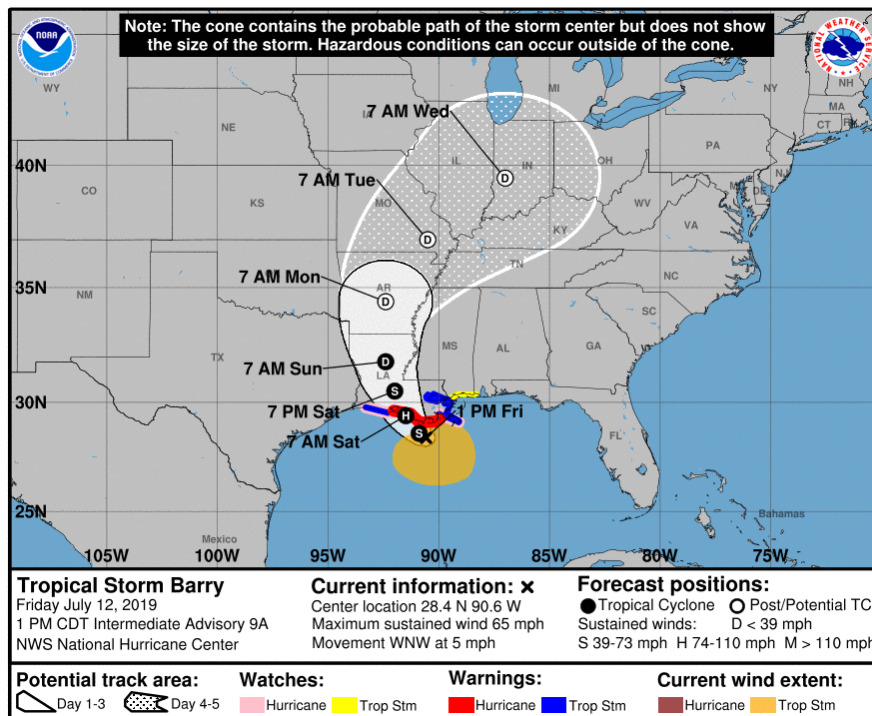

Dear Valued ONE Customers,

Tropical Storm Barry

We have received information from the National Weather Service, TS Barry continues to gradually strengthen while tracking westward across the North Central Gulf of Mexico. Intensification into a strong tropical storm or minimal hurricane is expected prior to landfall Saturday AM. Extreme rainfall totals and significant flooding will increase rapidly across most of Louisiana tonight into Saturday. Conditions should begin to improve late Saturday night into Sunday. Rainfall and flash flooding continues to be the main threat. Southwest Pass is beginning to feel the effects of the storm. The Mississippi River is still projected to rise to 19 feet on the Carrollton Gauge late Saturday night into Sunday.



Latest update for the Port of New Orleans:

Coast Guard:

Port Condition Zulu was implemented Friday afternoon. All vessel movements will be suspended unless an emergency situation arises. There are no THEA vessels in port.

Container Terminals

The gates were closed Thursday 7/11 at noon and will remain closed throughout the weekend. Plans are to reopen on Monday 7/15.

Vessel affected by this closure

ANG- TUBUL 1927 - original ETB 0001 7/11, - due to extreme weather and port closure, the decision was made for this vessel to omit New Orleans.

AL-MOL Gratitude 124, ETA to SW Pass 2100 7/15, - too early to determine if this vessel's schedule will be impacted.

Latest update for the Port of Houston:

Coast Guard

The Captain of the Port (COTP) has rescinded the Port Condition Whiskey and will return to normal operations for the ports of Houston. Heavy weather conditions from Tropical Storm Barry activity in the Gulf of Mexico are not expected to greatly impact the area.

Container Terminal
